State Senator Ron Grooms announces upcoming retirement

Will not be seeking re-election to District 46 seat in 2022

District 46 State Senator Ron Grooms announced on Friday, June 4 that he will not be seeking a fourth term in the Indiana Senate when his current term expires in November 2022. Grooms, a Republican, has represented District 46, which is composed of Floyd County and portions of Clark County, since 2010. "During my tenure in the State Senate I have worked on a variety of legislation of which I am proud," Grooms said. "In particular legislation creating the Clark Regional Airport Authority, cracking down on so-called 'pill mills' that were distributing large quantities of opioids, and was a key supporter of the construction of the Lewis and Clark and Lincoln Bridges and the rebuilding of the Kennedy Bridge."

"Sen. Grooms has been a faithful public servant for the communities he serves and a true asset in the Senate over the years as we have tackled complicated health care issues," said Senate President Pro Tem Rodric Bray (R-Martinsville). "We look forward to Sen. Grooms' continued input and added value for one more session, and will wish him the best as he concludes his service to our state." Grooms currently serves as Chairman of the Senate Committee on Family and Children Services and is also a member of the Senate Committees on Elections, Health and Provider Services, and Public Policy. He previously served on the Jeffersonville City Council, having been elected to five terms. "As Senator Grooms makes the decision to pass the torch for his Senate seat I reflect on our time together as public servants," said Lois Naville Endris, Floyd County Recorder.

"Ron has always had the time for a phone call, meeting, or to greet me in the Statehouse. He has been a friend to both the Indiana Records Association and also the Treasurer's Association. His ability to get things accomplished for the good of citizens has garnered him a lengthy list of accomplishments." He is endorsing Greenville Republican Kevin Boehnlein to succeed him. Boehnlein, a financial advisor for Edward Jones and long-time Republican party activist, recently announced his candidacy for the District 46 seat. "I endorse him without reservation. He has my full support," Grooms said. A retired small business owner and pharmacist, Grooms said he plans to spend more time with his family, golf, and travel, while remaining involved in the community. He resides in Jeffersonville and has two daughters and three grandchildren.

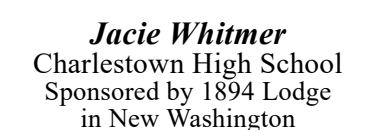

Officials discuss Commerce Connector Highway

State Sen. Ron Grooms (R-Jeffersonville) recently met with state and local officials to discuss ongoing efforts to develop a Commerce Connector Highway from the Clark Regional Airport to the River Ridge Commerce Center. Representatives from the Indiana Department of Transportation, the Indiana Economic Development Corporation, Gov. Eric Holcomb's Office and the Indiana Finance Authority joined Grooms and local officials from Clark County, Jack Coffman, Clark County commissioner, and Brian Dixon, Clark County engineer, presented possible routes between Clark Regional Airport and River Ridge, cost estimates of the project, sources of funding as well as the impact a connecting highway could have in the future. The Commerce Connector Highway would cost approximately \$50 million, which includes engineering, planning, land acquisition, labor and the construction of the highway. With the estimated cost,

Clark County officials are looking at multiple sources of funding to begin the process of starting this project. While it's currently not known how much local units will be able to provide, cities in the area like Sellersburg, New Albany, Jeffersonville and Clarksville, in addition to the Southern Indiana Chamber of Commerce, have all expressed support and plan to be involved moving forward. During the meeting, Grooms discussed the future impact this highway could have saying, "River Ridge Commerce Center currently has around 10,000 employees on location with the intent to grow further by a few thousand within the next couple of years. Pair that with Clark Regional Airport being at the heart of commerce in southern Indiana, and I believe this connector highway would be transformational for our area." The next step for local officials is to rezone the area needed for the highway.

ISP Sellersburg Investigates Fatal Memorial Day Crash



Troopers from Indiana State Police - Sellersburg are investigating a fatal car versus motorcycle crash that occurred Monday evening on a rural county road in northwestern Washington County.

Around 8:49 Monday evening, Troopers Kyle Taylor and Eric Powers, along with units from the Washington County Sheriff's Department, Washington County EMS, and the Campbellsburg Fire Department, responded to a crash in the 7000 block of North White River Road. When units arrived, they found two vehicles, a green 2000 Suzuki motorcycle and a 2001 Mercury Mountaineer SUV, off the east side of the roadway. The driver of the motorcycle, Jacob W. Lengel, 31, of Salem, Indiana, was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver of the Mountaineer, a 17-year-old male from Campbellsburg, Indiana, was not injured.

An Indiana State Police crash reconstruction team was called to assist. After a preliminary investigation, officers believe the motorcycle was southbound on White River Road and traveling at a high rate of speed. Investigators say the bike went left-of-center after rounding a corner and cresting a hill. Evidence at the scene indicates the driver of the northbound SUV attempted to avoid striking the motorcycle; however, both vehicles hit head-on on the east side of the roadway.

Investigators remained on-scene until approximately 1 a.m. on Tuesday. Alcohol is believed to be a factor in this crash. This crash is still under investigation.

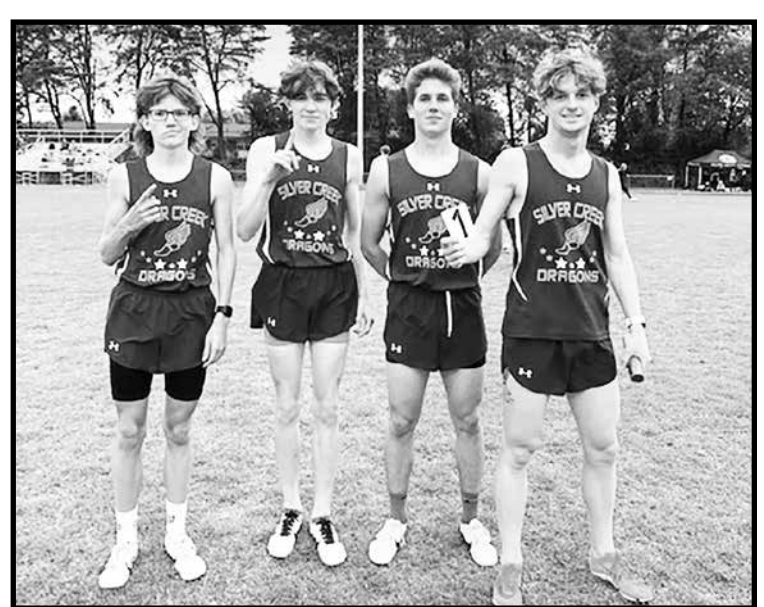
