## Forest Edge Development to Bring Luxury Apartment Housing Opportunities to Charlestown

The City of Charlestown is excited to announce the intentions of the Denton Floyd Real Estate Group to construct a 206-unit multi-family apartment community in the city. Denton Floyd (out of Louisville, KY) is committed to building better communities and will revitalize Depot Street with the Forest Edge project.

The garden-style apartment community to be called Forest Edge plans to have first-class amenities, including a clubhouse, a resort-style pool, a fitness center, and more. The project is located on Depot Street, which runs parallel to scenic Highway-62.

Historically, the property has been a train depot, a lumberyard and other retail establishments. The revitalization of Charlestown continues with this development to increase the population near the city's center.

"It's exciting to see this site transform from abandoned warehouses to beautiful apartments that will offer the quality of amenities that many people are seeking as they choose Charlestown for their new home," said Mayor Treva Hodges. "Denton Floyd has an outstanding reputation and we're fortunate they are investing in our community."

The community of apartments will have three layouts averaging 1,202 square feet:  
--1 Bedroom - 57 units - 817 SF  
--2 Bedrooms - 97 units - 1,256 SF  
--3 Bedrooms - 52 units - 1,522 SF



Beyond the spacious living quarters, the amenities will stand out in Charlestown. Among the features include a resort-style heated outdoor pool, a 24-hour fitness center, a community clubhouse, an outdoor common area with fire pits and gourmet grilling stations. Amenities also include a children's playground area, a bicycle repair station, storage areas, a pet park, and a pet spa.

"We take our commitment to building better communities seriously and believe our investment in Charlestown will support the city's continued growth," said Denton Floyd Co-Founder Brandon Denton. "Forest Edge will provide a much-needed housing option for hundreds of residents and

also build on the region's economic success and flourishing job growth."

The City of Charlestown's Madison Street improvements are in the future plans to strengthen the connectivity from Forest Edge to Main Street. While the conceptual designs aren't complete yet, the enhancements include widening the roadway and adding sidewalks.

One block from the future development is Main Street, which is currently undergoing sidewalk reconstruction from Madison to Main Cross Streets.

The project construction start date is February 2023 with the leasing start date of February 2024. Construction completion is expected to be January 2025.

## Bray appoints State Sen. Chris Garten Senate Majority Floor Leader

Senate President Pro Tem Rodric Bray (R-Martinsville) has announced he has appointed State Sen. Chris Garten (R-Charlestown) Majority Floor Leader of the Senate Majority Caucus.

The Majority Floor Leader is the second-ranking leadership position in the Senate Majority Caucus and helps develop and enforce the rules of the Senate.

"Serving as the Majority Floor Leader is truly an honor, and I'm grateful to Sen. Bray for extending this unique opportunity to me," Garten said. "As I step into this role, my primary goal will be to ensure mutual respect for all members of our revered chamber while continuing to represent the issues important to Hoosiers in Senate District 45."

Bray appointed Garten to the position in recognition of his strong leadership abilities and principled, common-sense approach as a legislator.

"Sen. Garten has proven himself a highly capable and passionate leader, and I'm looking forward to working closely with him on our

leadership team in the coming legislative session," Bray said. "Chris is a problem-solver who is dedicated to public service, and I think he will do a great job in this new role."

Garten attended Indiana University Southeast while working full time and serving in the Marine Corps Reserve. As a Marine, Garten served in Iraq in 2003 and 2005-2006, and is currently a gunnery sergeant in the Marine Corps Reserve. In addition to serving his country in the Marine Corps, he founded Signature Countertops, Inc., an award-winning industry and market leader in natural stone surfacing and counter tops.

Garten assumes the Majority Floor Leader role beginning Wednesday, August 17.

Bray added that he is grateful for the contributions former Majority Floor Leader State Sen. Mark Messmer (R-Jasper) has made to the caucus and Senate as a whole. Bray said Messmer will remain chair of the Senate Committee on Environmental Affairs and will continue to play an important role in the Senate Majority Caucus and full Senate.

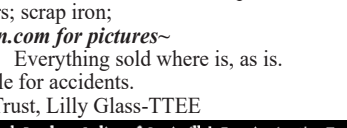

## Two Baptist Health hospitals make history by performing, offering Aquablation procedure for BPH

Baptist Health Louisville and Baptist Health Floyd made a little history recently.

Both hospitals are the first in the region to offer an advanced, minimally invasive treatment to help men who suffer from Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (BPH), also known as an enlarged prostate. Baptist Health Louisville was the first hospital in Kentucky to perform the procedure while Baptist Health Floyd is the only full-service hospital in Southern Indiana offering Aquablation therapy.

Each hospital received \$300,000 to go toward the purchase of the robot used for the Aquablation procedure from their respective foundations – Baptist Health Foundation Greater Louisville and the Floyd Memorial Foundation.

What makes the Aquablation method so unique is the surgeon uses waterjet technology, which reduces the risk for incontinence and sexual side effects that are associated with traditional BPH procedures.

Christopher Smith, MD, with First Urology, completed the first four cases using the Aquablation method at Baptist Health Louisville, and said he was very pleased with the outcomes. Three of the four patients went home the next day and the fourth patient was discharged on the second day.

“The first cases went great. The staff was fantastic,” he said.

Dr. Smith said he expects to stay busy performing the procedure at Baptist Health Louisville, adding that he has several cases scheduled through August.

Hal Rosenbaum, MD, with First Urology, completed the first two cases June 27 at Baptist Health Floyd. He also said both procedures went well and expects

## Structure replaced at historic Swayback Cemetery thanks donors' generosity



The Swayback Cemetery, which is located on Daisy Hill Road in Washington County, has recently gotten some updates to the property. The cemetery property has an interesting history that goes back many years. The cemetery dates back to the 1870s, and contains burial sites for some Civil War Veterans.

The cemetery receives no funding from tax dollars, and the property has been maintained for many years by members of the Coats family, where they are board members there. The lawn maintenance for the area is no small task as it requires much care in mowing around the graves and keeping weeds at bay. Many members of the Coats family have also been laid to rest in the Swayback Cemetery and even attended school there.

There was a chapel on the grounds that was at least 100 years old. The chapel at one time was a one room school house where students in grades one through twelve attended. Unfortunately, in 2012 when the tornado came through, that chapel building disappeared completely and remnants of the building and the pews inside have not been found. There was no insurance or funds available to replace the historic structure.

Thanks to contributions from community members and businesses, a new structure was recently placed on the property. Lowe's Distribution Center, of North Vernon, Indiana donated the structure supplies. Ernst Concrete supplied the concrete, and Feeler Concrete donated labor for the project. BC Construction also completed the building. The generosity of these businesses and anyone else who assisted is greatly appreciated.

Each year, a memorial service is held on the Sunday prior to Memorial Day to honor the veterans there.
