

Structure replaced at historic Swayback Cemetery thanks donors' generousity




The Swayback Cemetery, which is located on Daisy Hill Road in Washington County, has recently gotten some updates to the property. The cemetery property has an interesting history that goes back many years. The cemetery dates back to the 1870s, and contains burial sites for some Civil War Veterans.

The cemetery receives no funding from tax dollars, and the property has been maintained for many years by members of the Coats family, where they are board members there. The lawn maintance for the area is no small task as it requires much care in mowing around the graves and keeping weeds at bay. Many members of the Coats family have also been laid to rest in the Swayback Cemetery and even attended school there.

There was a chapel on the grounds that was at least 100 years old. The chapel at one time was a one room school house where students in grades one through twelve attended. Unfortunately, in 2012 when the tornado came through, that chapel building disappeared completely and remnants of the building and the pews inside have not been found. There was no insurance or funds available to replace the historic structure.

Thanks to contributions from community members and businesses, a new structure was recently placed on the property. Lowe's Distribution Center, of North Vernon, Indiana donated the structure supplies. Ernst Concrete supplied the concrete, and Feeler Concrete donated labor for the project. BC Construction also completed the building. The generousity of these businesses and anyone else who assisted is greatly appreciated.

Each year, a memorial service is held on the Sunday prior to Memorial Day to honor the veterans there.
