## Leota Country Frolic Set for August 26-27 in Scott County

The 39<sup>th</sup> annual Leota Country Frolic will be held on Friday and Saturday, August 26 and 27 in downtown Leota in Scott County. This event will be held to mark the 138<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this small-rich historical community. There will be great food provided by the Scottsburg High School FFA featuring fish, tenderloins, bean soup, french fries, hot dogs and famous homemade pies, and drinks. There will be a talent showcase with ribbons being awarded to the top talent. Pedal Pull contests will be held on Friday at 6 p.m. and Saturday at 4 p.m. First place trophies will be awarded. Come out enjoy a variety of gospel, bluegrass and country music scheduled throughout the two-day event. An antique farm machinery show will also be featured on the grounds of the frolic.

A quilt raffle will be held. Tickets will be \$1 for one ticket or six tickets for \$5. A cross-cut saw souvenir will be available. Scott County School District 1 officials in Austin met with engineers and project management with the Indiana Department of Transportation today. We discussed a future sidewalk project that will increase student and pedestrian traffic coming to and from our campus. The project will hopefully include sidewalks on both sides of US 31 from Cherry Street to York Road.

## Asphalt resurface planned on U.S. 31 in Scottsburg

Indiana Department of Transportation contractor E&B Paving Inc. plans to begin work on an asphalt resurface project on U.S. 31 in Scottsburg starting on or after Wednesday, August 24. Crews will be active from York Road to S.R. 56. Work will start with patching along U.S. 31, followed by milling and paving. Traffic will be shifted with one lane open in each direction. Access will be maintained for businesses and residents throughout the project.

In mid-September signal modifications are scheduled to begin at the intersection of U.S. 31 and Owen Street. Motorists can expect flagging and temporary stoppages while work is in progress at this location. Construction is expected to last between six and eight weeks, depending upon weather and other factors. Following paving, the roadway will be reconfigured between York Road and S.R. 56 to include a center two-way left turn lane, with one travel lane in each direction. This change follows a pattern of crashes involving motorists turning left on U.S. 31 and will improve corridor safety by giving drivers a dedicated area to safely wait to turn. The \$563,000 contract was awarded to E&B in February and has a completion date of October 31, 2022. INDOT reminds drivers to slow down, use caution and watch for workers and equipment in active work zones. All work is weather dependent and schedules are subject to change.

### Community Theatre Presents Family-Friendly Classic Comedy Aug. 26-28

What happens when an efficiency expert father, a psychologist mother, and a boisterous gang of twelve children get together?

The interesting result is portrayed in playwright Christopher Sergel's "Cheaper by the Dozen," a stage adaptation of the memoir by the same name written by two of the grownup Gilbreth children. Starting in 1948 with "Cheaper by the Dozen," Frank Gilbreth, Jr., and Ernestine Gilbreth Carey co-authored three books that detailed their chaotic yet joyful years as a family. Washington County Theatre (WCT) will present the play "Cheaper by the Dozen" on August 26, 27, and 28 at Gary W. Hartsook Hall in Salem.

Frank Gilbreth was a bricklayer and building contractor in the early 1900s until he left those businesses to study what he called "waste motions." Factories and government agencies hired him to time their workers performing tasks and find ways to make their work easier, faster, and less stressful. He teamed up with Lillian Moller in 1904 both in marriage and in their shared professional interest of industrial engineering. Together, they formed their large family and carried on efficiency research, and, at Gilbreth's early death in 1924, Lillian carried on their work as a "tribute" to her late husband.

Among many other "firsts" that she achieved in her lifetime, she was the first female faculty member in the College of Engineering at Purdue University, where she was a professor of management (1935-1948). She advised six U.S. Presidents on a wide range of projects aimed at helping wounded veterans and increasing wartime production of needed goods. She worked for General Electric, designing the first refrigerator shelves and the foot-pedal garbage can. In the spirit of her husband's past labors, Lillian waged war on the worker's fatigue and believed that people's well-being was more important than machines, two key beliefs that guided the work they had shared.

WCT's production focuses on the way Gilbreth daily demonstrated his interest in shaving "waste motion" minutes from the time it took his children to do everything from take a bath to wash dishes. The play's scenes constantly shift from one activity to the next, as the family experiences normal happenings like the first date of Anne, the oldest daughter (played by Lindsey Pieper), and the youngest boys' desire to get a dog - a dog that, unfortunately, seems to always be in the wrong place at the wrong time, in Dad's view.

At several times during the play, Frank, Jr. (Avan Ewing), and Ernestine (Carolyn Casey) narrate from the side of the stage, describing standout moments with their parents that are lifted right out of the pages of their memoirs. Thirteen-year-old Flora Wade, who portrays Martha Gilbreth in the play, said that she was amazed to learn just how beloved the Gilbreths' books are by many people.

"The Gilbreth family is iconic, and the way they still influence us today is crazy. Even though it's an older book, it brings us back to the way we connect with each other now and makes us aware that we should really make every second count with one another," Wade explained.

Daniel Main, president of WCT's Board of Trustees, plays Frank Gilbreth in the show. Main urged anyone interested in family-style entertainment make the short trip to Salem in order to give "Cheaper by the Dozen" a chance.

"It's a great story to tell, very family-friendly and fun, and everyone who comes is guaranteed to laugh and have a great time. The message of the play is an important one for our time: making sure that, as hard as we work and as much as we try to save time and be more efficient, we don't forget to do the most important thing. And that's to show love to those we care about," Main said.

The show's cast features Charity Main in the role of Mrs. Gilbreth. The other children of the family are played by Lucas Hein, Juneau Main, Wil Sears, and Elliot Hein. Mariah Dillon portrays the family's long-suffering cook, Mrs. Fitzgerald, and Mark Carter plays Doctor Burton, who has to break the news to Dad about his terrible heart condition. Nathan Cleghorn plays Anne's suitor, Larry, and Casey Miller plays skeptical Miss Brill, the school teacher who is not impressed by the Gilbreth children's accomplishments.

Directed by Lydia Casey, "Cheaper by the Dozen" will be presented at Gary W. Hartsook Hall at 402 N. Harrison Street, behind the Church of the Nazarene in Salem. No reservations are necessary, and tickets (\$10 for adults and \$8 for students/seniors) are available at the door a half-hour before the shows. Refreshments are offered on a donation basis. On Friday and Saturday (August 26 and 27), shows are at 7:30 p.m., and the Sunday show on August 28 starts at 2:00 p.m.

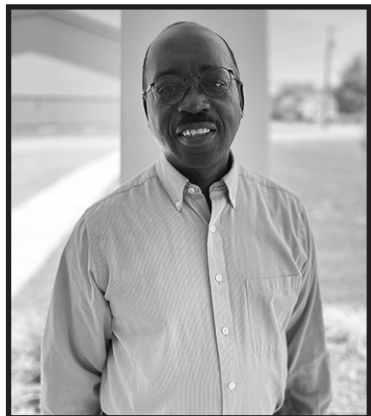

## Robert Milner Named as Executive Director for The Refuge for Children in Austin

Six years ago, Pastor Steve Gwaltney and Sheriff Jerry Goodin shared a common vision with Grace Covenant Church family. Their concern centered around children being removed from harmful home situations, mostly due to substance misuse.

Taking steps of faith, Grace Covenant continued sharing their vision with the Scott County community, and now this vision is a reality. The unified efforts of the community working together have created a beautiful space for displaced children by providing a haven where youth can find recovery from trauma

and new hope in life.

According to Steve Gwaltney, Pastor of Grace Covenant, "Financial and time commitments from caring individuals and community sectors affirm the passion and mission for the children that The Refuge will serve. We are thrilled to open our doors soon to these children."

The mission of The Refuge for Children is to reduce the harmful impact of trauma on abused, neglected, and displaced children by providing a stable and loving haven.

Located in Scott County, Indiana, it serves as an Emergency Shelter for at-risk youth, providing a temporary, structured, and hopeful environment in a 10-bedroom facility.

The board is excited to announce that Robert "Bud" Milner is the Executive Director of The Refuge. In early 2019 Pastor Gwaltney visited the Indiana United Methodist Children's Home (IUMCH) in Lebanon, IN, where he learned about the Teaching Family Model, a concept the board adopted for The Refuge. Having worked for faith-based organizations with a full continuum of services (residential care, foster care, home based, and clinical) since 1983 in North Carolina, Ohio, and Indiana, he has been involved with new home openings, reopening, licensing, and relicensing of group homes, foster homes, emergency shelters, and

schools. He has trained and consulted with numerous organizations across multiple states in the Teaching Family Model implementation and is accredited by the Teaching Family Association. His familiarity with the Indiana State licensing process and expertise providing administrative leadership and oversight over the licensing of newly built homes and relicensing of existing homes has been invaluable to The Refuge.

Mr. Milner shares, "Children removed from their homes for no fault of their own in Scott and surrounding counties will now be close to the community and people to which they are familiar, thereby preventing further trauma of placement in an emergency shelter hours away. The Refuge Emergency Shelter Group home will allow local youth removed temporarily to stay in their schools and nearer to family and friends."

The Refuge gives hope by providing immediate trauma-informed and compassionate care to displaced children. ### Prosecutor Owens Urges Bus Awareness As School Begins

As Summer comes to a close, it's time for the children in Scott County to head back to school. That means, once again, school buses and school bus stops will be a part of the daily commute for all of us.

With school starting, Prosecutor Owens wanted to take a moment to remind everyone to slow down around school buses and school bus stops and to stop when the school bus stop-arm is extended and the red lights are flashing. Unfortunately, school bus stop-arm violations are all too common in Indiana and can lead to fatal results.

Last April, the Indiana Department of Education did a one-day survey

with thousands of bus drivers from across the state participating. For one day, 6,665 bus drivers from 195 school districts took part in an observational survey where the drivers counted stop-arm violations throughout the day. In just one day, the drivers recorded 2,041 violations.

Ignoring school bus stop-arms is not only against the law, it can be deadly. Several school age children lost their lives during the 2021-22 school year due to negligent and reckless drivers.

"There's no excuse for ignoring school bus stop-arms," said Chris Owens, Scott County Prosecuting Attorney. "For kids to learn and

grow, they must be able to get to school safely. Slow down and stop when you see buses on the road. Our office takes these offenses seriously and we will continue to prosecute people who run school bus stop arms."

"Disregarding a school bus stop-arm is a Class A Infraction, which could result in fines and a license suspension, and could impact costs of insurance. If a driver is charged with recklessly passing a stop-arm, it's a Class A Misdemeanor, which could result in jail time. Further punishment could come if injuries or death occur as a result of the reckless passing," noted Owens.

Operation Bottom Line is an ongoing ministry of the church and will distribute the diapers on the last Wednesday in August from 4 to 6 p.m.

To be eligible, birth certificate of child (children), proof of income, and proof of residence, such as check stub, utility bill, rent receipt, etc., is required. WIC recipients need to only show their WIC card. Once registered nothing further is required and families are encouraged to come every month as long as they need diapers. The diapers can be picked up inside the main entrance to the church; the double glass doors at street level on Hyland. The church is located at the corner of Vest and Hyland in Scottsburg.

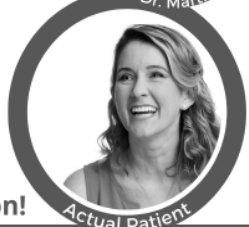
