





Six years ago, Pastor Steve Gwaltney and Sheriff Jerry Goodin shared a common vision with Grace Covenant Church family. concern centered around children being removed from harmful home situations, mostly due to substance

Taking steps of faith, Grace Covenant continued sharing their vision with the Scott County community, and now this vision is a reality. The unified efforts of the community working together have created a beautiful space for displaced and new hope in life. According to Steve Gwaltney Pastor of Grace Covenant, "Financial

and time commitments from caring individuals and community sectors affirm the passion and mission for the children that The Refuge will serve. We are thrilled to open our doors soon to these children.'

The mission of The Refuge for Children is to reduce the harmful impact of trauma on abused, neglected, and displaced children by providing a stable and loving haven.

Located in Scott County, Indiana, it serves as an Emergency Shelter for at-risk youth, providing a temporary, structured, and hopeful environment in a 10-bedroom facility.

The board is excited to announce that Robert "Bud" Milner is the Executive Director of The Refuge. In early 2019 Pastor Gwaltney visited the Indiana United Methodist Children's Home (IUMCH) in Lebanon, IN, where he learned about the Teaching Family Model, a concept the board adopted for The Refuge. Having worked for faith-based organizations with a full continuum of services (residential care, foster care, home based, and clinical) since 1983 in North Carolina, Ohio, and Indiana, he has been involved with new home openings, reopening, licensing, and

schools. He has trained and consulted with numerous organizations across multiple states in the Teaching Family Model implementation and is accredited by the Teaching Family Association. His familiarity with the Indiana State licensing process and expertise providing administrative leadership and oversight over the licensing of newly built homes and relicensing of existing homes has been invaluable to The Refuge.

"Children Mr. Milner shares, removed from their homes for no fault of their own in Scott and surrounding counties will now be close to the community and people to which they are familiar, thereby preventing further trauma of placement in an emergency shelter

"Disregarding a school bus stoparm is a Class A Infraction, which could result in fines and a license suspension, and could impact costs of insurance. If a driver is charged with recklessly passing a stop-arm, it's a Class A Misdemeanor, which "There's no excuse for ignoring could result in jail time. Further punishment could come if injuries or death occur as a result of the reckless passing," noted Owens.






